VOTER REGISTRATION INFORMATION

In Georgia, voters must be registered to vote 30 days prior to the election in order to be eligible to vote in the election and any subsequent runoff. A Voter Registration Application must be completely filled out and signed. A voter must provide a valid residence address. A voter's Election Day polling place is assigned specific to where their residence lies within the designated precinct lines.

The Voter Registration Deadline for the November 2, 2021 election is: Monday, October 4, 2021

All voters are encouraged to confirm they are registered to vote and their name and address appear correctly in the statewide voter registration system. Go to www.mvp.sos.ga.gov to verify your information or call the Elections Office.

REGISTER TO VOTE OR CHANGE YOUR INFORMATION

Forsyth County residents who need to register to vote or change their name and/or address can do so:

Online: Go to registertovote.sos.ga.gov/GAOLVR/ or www.mvp.sos.ga.gov.

The Online Voter Registration System can be used with or without a valid Georgia driver's license or identification number. If you have a valid driver's license or identification card issued by the GA Department of Driver Services (DDS) with your signature on file with DDS, your application can be completed and submitted online. The Application must be dated and time-stamped no later than 11:59 p.m. on the Voter Registration Deadline date. If you do not have a valid Georgia driver's license or identification card, you will be prompted to print, sign and manually submit a paper registration application. The Application must be USPS postmarked by the Voter Registration Deadline date or delivered in person to our office no later than the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the Voter Registration Deadline date in order to be eligible to vote in the upcoming election.

<u>In person:</u> You can register to vote at the Forsyth County Voter Registrations & Elections Office, located at 1201 Sawnee Dr., Cumming, GA 30040 or at any of the four public libraries in the county. The Elections Office hours are Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The application must be delivered to our office no later than the close of business on the Voter Registration Deadline date in order to be eligible to vote in the upcoming election. The public libraries are open every day with varying hours. For library registrations, the application must be completed by the close of business on the Voter Registration Deadline date in order to be eligible to vote in the upcoming election. Applications can be downloaded at www.forsythco.com and are also available at the Elections Office and at any public library.

By mail: The application must be USPS postmarked by the Voter Registration Deadline date. Applications can be downloaded at www.forsythco.com and are also available at the Elections Office and at any public library.

All properly completed applications received by the Voter Registrations & Elections Office that do not meet the above deadline will be processed after the certification of the November 2, 2021 election results.

VOTER REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

In order to be eligible to register to vote, a person must be a citizen of the United States and the State of Georgia, at least $17 \frac{1}{2}$ years of age, a resident of the county or municipality in which he/she seeks to vote, not currently serving a felony conviction, AND not judicially determined to be mentally incompetent to vote.

PHOTO ID REQUIRED TO VOTE

All voters voting in person will be asked to provide one of the six acceptable forms of photo identification: GA driver's license (valid or expired), valid ID card by any state or U.S. with photo, valid U.S. passport, valid government employee photo ID, valid U.S. military ID card with photo, or valid tribal ID card with photo. First-time voters who registered by mail without providing a photo ID may also provide a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that contains the name and address of the voter.

If you do not have one of these forms of photo identification, you are eligible to receive a free Georgia ID card for voting purposes ONLY. These cards are issued in the Voter Registrations & Elections Office. Please call us at 770-781-2118 for more information or to schedule an appointment to have a free Georgia ID card for voting purposes made.

ELECTION DEFINITIONS

An explanation of terms as used in this guide.

Absentee Voter: Per Georgia Election Code 21-2-380 (a) the term "absentee elector" means an elector of this state who casts a ballot in a primary, election or runoff other than in person at the polls on Election Day. Any voter who votes in person during Advance Voting or who requests their ballot be mailed to them is classified as an 'Absentee Voter.' They are 'absent' from their polling place on Election Day.

<u>Ballot:</u> A ballot is an "official ballot" or "paper ballot" and includes the instrument, whether paper, mechanical, or electronic, by which an elector casts his or her vote.

Elector: An elector is a person who possesses all of the qualifications for voting now or hereafter prescribed by the laws of this state, including applicable charter provisions, and is a registered voter.

General Election: A General Election is usually held at regular intervals in which candidates are elected in all or most constituencies of a nation, state or municipality. On November 2, the City of Cumming Municipal General Election will be held for the office of Mayor and two City Council seats. Only voters who reside in the city limits of Cumming and who are registered to vote by the October 4, 2021 voter registration deadline are eligible to vote in the November 2, 2021 election. The City of Cumming is in the center of Forsyth County and includes approximately 3,780 registered voters. In the City of Cumming Municipal General Election, the election is decided by a plurality of the votes cast (whichever candidate in each race receives the most votes is the winner).

Oath: An oath shall include affirmation.

Polling Place: A polling place is the room provided in each precinct for voting at a primary or election.

Precinct: A precinct is synonymous with the term "voting precinct" and means a geographical area, established in accordance with this chapter, from which all electors vote at one polling place.

Primary: A primary is any election held for the purpose of electing party officers or nominating candidates for public offices to be voted for at an election.

Special Election: A Special Election is an election scheduled at other than the usual date for a specific purpose, often to fill an office that has become vacant before the incumbent has completed the term or to pose a question to the voters. A countywide Special Election will be held on November 2 for the Educational Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (E-SPLOST) referendum. All voters registered to vote in Forsyth County by the October 4, 2021 voter registration deadline are eligible to vote in the Special Election.

GEORGIA VOTERS DO NOT REGISTER BY PARTY

In Georgia, voters do not register by party. On the day of a Primary, each registered voter chooses a Democratic, Republican or NonPartisan General/Special Election (if applicable) ballot. When voting in a General Election or Special Election voters do not designate a ballot type.

ABSENTEE VOTING

Any registered voter can vote prior to Election Day. Georgia offers advance voting in person and absentee voting by mail.

VOTE BY MAIL AT YOUR CONVENIENCE

A registered voter may request a ballot be mailed to them for any election. Georgia does not require the voter to provide a reason for the request.

Request a Ballot be Mailed to You

To request an absentee ballot by mail, a voter is required to complete an "Application for Georgia Official Absentee Ballot." Voters may access and print an application online. The application can be found on our website at https://www.forsythco.com/Departments-Offices/Voter-Registrations-Elections. Voters may also contact our office to have an absentee ballot application mailed or faxed to them for completion. The application can also be downloaded from the Georgia Secretary of State's website (www.sos.ga.gov).

Voters may request an absentee ballot by utilizing the online Absentee Ballot Application portal when there are state/federal races/questions on the ballot. The voter must have a Georgia driver's license and/or Georgia ID number in their voter record in order to use this application. The signature on the application will come from the signature on the voter's GA DL/ID. Given there are no state/federal races/questions on the upcoming ballot, the online portal is NOT an option for voters for this election.

Please follow the directions and complete the application accordingly. Incomplete applications may not be accepted if required information is missing or incorrect. For example, you must include your birthday; it is not optional. Call the office if you have any questions. It is highly recommended that you include contact information.

How to Submit a Completed & Signed Absentee Ballot Application

The completed and signed Application for Georgia Official Absentee Ballot Application should be submitted to the Forsyth County Voter Registrations & Elections Office by: 1) email of a scanned copy, 2) email of a picture of the signed application, 3) fax, 4) mail or 5) personal delivery.

Deadline to Request a Ballot be Mailed to You

Voters may request an absentee ballot by mail beginning 78 days prior to an election. Our office is now accepting Applications for the November 2 Special Election and City of Cumming General Election. Requests for absentee ballots are usually processed within three business days after receipt in our office once the ballots are available for the specified election. The last day an absentee ballot application can be accepted in our office for the November 2 election is Friday, October 22, 2021 by the close of business (4:30 p.m.).

Once You Submit Your Application to Have an Absentee Ballot Mailed to You, What Happens Next?

- If the application meets all requirements, a ballot will be mailed to the voter.
- If the application *does not* meet all requirements, the voter will be contacted by the Elections Office by letter, or, possibly, by phone or email if the voter's contact information was included on the application.

How do I know if my application met all the requirements?

Go to www.mvp.sos.ga.gov. Login by entering your information. On your "My Voter Page" look under "Click here for Absentee Ballot status." The page displayed will show if your application was accepted. Additionally, your absentee ballot status will be updated when your ballot is issued, when your voted ballot is received and if your ballot was accepted.

When will my ballot be mailed to me?

If you submit a properly completed application, then your ballot is expected to be mailed to you within three business days of our office receiving your completed application once ballots can be mailed. October 11 is the earliest date to mail an absentee ballot for the upcoming election.

What if I do not receive my ballot in a timely fashion?

If, after a reasonable amount of time, you have not received your ballot or received follow up communication from our office, do not delay -- contact our office. There is a process to re-issue a ballot lost in the mail. It is better to start that process sooner rather than later.

What do I do when I receive my absentee ballot in the mail?

Follow the instructions included with your ballot. Provide **ALL** requested information. Do not forget to sign the 'Oath of Elector.' When your ballot is returned, the information you provided is compared to the information on your previous registration(s) and your absentee ballot application in order to verify your identity. The 'Oath of Elector' signature is compared to your signature on file to verify that you signed the oath. If the 'Oath of Elector' is not signed or if required information is missing or questionable, the processing of your ballot will require additional communication with our office before your ballot can be accepted.

What if I make a mistake when marking my ballot?

Do not spoil or destroy your ballot. If, after you have marked your ballot and you need to make a change, call the office for instructions.

How quickly do I need to return my voted ballot to your office?

A voter may return their voted absentee ballot as soon as they have made their selections, provided the required information and signed the 'Oath of Elector.' Absentee ballots can be returned to our office either by mail or by personal delivery. Drop box delivery is only available during Advance Voting. The latest a voter may return their voted ballot is Election Day, which means it must be in our office before the polls close at 7 p.m. on Election Day in order to be accepted. The postmark date does <u>NOT</u> count. (There are special provisions for voters in the military and/or living overseas. Contact our office for details).

Where/How can I return my voted absentee ballot?

Voted absentee ballots may be returned by mail or they may be deposited into the Official Absentee Ballot Drop Box available at the Forsyth County Elections Office located at 1201 Sawnee Drive, Cumming, 30040. For the upcoming election, the drop box will be open during the same dates and hours as the Advance Voting locations. See page 8 for more details.

How do I know if my voted absentee ballot was received by your office?

Check it out online. Go to www.mvp.sos.ga.gov. Login by entering your information. On your "My Voter Page" click on "Click here for Absentee Ballot status" under the 'Absentee Ballot Request Information' header and the page displayed will show if and when your voted ballot was received. Don't have access to the internet? Contact the Elections Office. We are happy to verify the information for you.

When will my voted absentee ballot be counted?

Absentee ballots will be counted on Election Day. All absentee ballots remain sealed and under lock and key until the absentee ballot processing starts. Ballot results are not tabulated until Election Day. And, yes, following Georgia Election Code all absentee ballots submitted and accepted are counted in the final totals for every election.

What if I request a ballot be mailed to me and then I decide I want to vote in person?

No problem. If you have received your ballot, take it with you to the polling place and surrender it to the poll worker. Your absentee ballot will be cancelled in the system and then you will be allowed to vote in person on the election equipment. If you have not received your ballot or it has been lost/destroyed, you will be instructed by the poll worker to complete an Affidavit attesting to not having your ballot in your possession. After the poll worker contacts the Elections Office and confirms you have not already returned your voted ballot, your absentee ballot will be cancelled in the system and then you will be allowed to vote in person on the election equipment. There are checks and balances in place throughout the process to ensure each voter casts just one ballot.

If the Elections Office has already received your properly submitted voted absentee ballot, then you have been given credit for voting and the ballot you returned to the Elections Office will be counted. In this case, you will not be allowed to vote in person. Once your absentee ballot has been received by the Elections Office and checked into the system it cannot be cancelled.

ABSENTEE VOTING TURNOUT STATISTICS

The Forsyth County Voter Registrations & Elections Office posts the Absentee Voting Turnout Statistics Report, which includes how many absentee ballots have been mailed, how many voted ballots have been returned to the Elections Office, as well as how many voters have cast their ballot by Absentee Voting In Person (Advance Voting), to our website daily. The turnout statistics posted are through the day before and are posted by approximately 10:00 a.m.

VOTE IN PERSON EARLY, BEFORE ELECTION DAY, DURING 3 WEEKS OF ADVANCE VOTING

Advance Voting in person is available for three weeks, including two Saturdays, prior to Election Day. Poll workers will follow the county, state and federal recommended guidelines, which means that extra steps are being taken to limit the threat of COVID-19 at the polling place. Voters who show up to vote in person will be instructed to maintain a safe distance throughout the voting process to help ensure the health and safety of the voters and the poll workers. The number of touchscreens and printers has been reduced to provide the recommended spacing. Additionally, the voting equipment and other items will be sanitized routinely. Adjustments to the voting process have been made to help counteract any added wait time that the reduction and cleaning of voting equipment might cause, such as streamlining the check-in and ID verification processes. Even with these adjustments, it is possible that you will experience increased wait times and lines during Advance Voting; however, you will leave the voting area confident that precautions were taken to keep you safe.

Advance Voting is scheduled to take place weekdays beginning, Tuesday, October 12 through Friday, October 29, and Saturday, October 16 and Saturday, October 23. All Forsyth County registered voters may take advantage of Advance Voting in person during the hours and dates posted, regardless of where they are assigned to vote on Election Day.

The first day of Advance Voting will be Tuesday, October 12, 2021. While 21-2-385(d)(1)(A) states that advance voting shall commence the fourth Monday prior to the general election, October 11 is Columbus Day, a state holiday. SB 202 amended the code section such that voting would not be conducted on observed state holidays. While Forsyth County does not observe Columbus Day, the state does; therefore, the first day of Advance Voting will be Tuesday, October 12.

Voters are encouraged to review their Sample Ballot prior to going to the polls to vote and may do so by going to www.mvp.sos.ga.gov.

VOTING ON ELECTION DAY, November 2

Voting Hours 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

- On Election Day, Tuesday, November 2, 2021, voters must go to their designated polling place to vote.
- All 19 Forsyth County Election Day polling places are open for voting from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Election Day.
- Only the voters registered by October 4, 2021 are eligible to vote.
- The Special Election affects all registered voters in Forsyth County.
- Only voters who live inside the city limits of Cumming are eligible to vote in the Cumming Municipal General Election.

Poll workers will follow the county, state and federal recommended guidelines, which means that extra steps are being taken to limit the threat of COVID-19 at the polling place. Voters who show up to vote in person will be instructed to maintain a safe distance throughout the voting process to help ensure the health and safety of the voters and the poll workers. The number of touchscreens and printers has been reduced to provide the recommended spacing. Additionally, the voting equipment and other items will be sanitized routinely. Adjustments to the voting process have been made to help counteract any added wait time that the reduction and cleaning of voting equipment might cause, such as streamlining the check-in and ID verification processes. Even with these adjustments, it is possible that you will experience increased wait times and lines on Election Day; however, you will leave the voting area confident that precautions were taken to keep you safe.

IMPORTANT CHANGE: If you go to a precinct that is not your assigned precinct, you cannot cast a valid Out of Precinct (OP) provisional ballot before 5:00 p.m. If you want your vote to count, you will need to go to your assigned precinct to vote or wait until 5:00 p.m. at the unassigned precinct to vote an OP provisional ballot. There are no exceptions.

Things to Note on Election Day:

ATTENTIONPolling places changes effective August 2021 for voters assigned to the 29-Polo and 37-Sawnee precincts: Voters assigned to the 29-Polo precinct, who voted at Grace Chapel Church of Christ, have been reassigned to the Fowler Park Recreation Center for the upcoming election. Voters assigned to the 37-Sawnee precinct, who voted at the Parks & Recreation Natural Resources Operations Center, have been reassigned to Greater Heights Baptist Church. 


